Guide to ATV and UTV Laws in Idaho

Non-residents who wish to operate an ATV or UTV in Idaho are not required to register in Idaho if they possess a valid OHV registration from their home state of residence.

If you do not have a valid OHV registration from your home state, you must obtain a valid IDPR OHV registration sticker before operating you ATV or UTV on public lands in Idaho.

If you are operating an ATV or UTV on the road in Idaho, it is required that you have a working brake light, headlight and taillight if dark or poor visibility, a horn audible from 200 feet, and a mirror showing at least 200 feet behind the ATV or UTV. Adult ATV/UTV riders are not required by law to wear a helmet. Of course, it is always smart to wear a helmet regardless of the law.
